I looked in QST and saw that February is the birth month of Thomas Edison and there are two special events celebrating this. He was born February 11, 1847. I remember in the early 50's seeing Edison's movie studio in East Orange, New Jersey and in the 80's visiting Ford's Greenfield Village and viewing Edison's laboratories. I never thought anything of his labs being there until I received a certificate from W4LX. The certificate reads in part:

"W4LX operated during the Festival of Light week from the porch of the Henry Ford Estate. Thomas Edison and Henry Ford were good friends as well as neighbors. Today the City of Fort Myers operates and maintains

the Edison-Ford complex as a historical museum. Edison's laboratory and botanical gardens can be viewed along with many of his inventions. Much of Edison's research in improving the electric light bulb filament occurred at his winter home here in Fort Meyers, Florida. Edison also conducted research in the quest for a substitute for rubber. Most of the plants in his tropical botanical garden were cultivated for these purposes.

Ham radio also owes Edison thanks for many improvements to the art and science of telegraphy and the apparatus thereof."

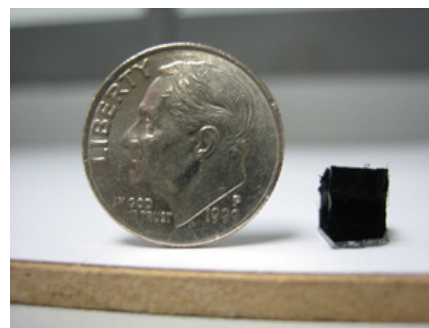


Info 4 You

Nanotechnology revolves around the creation of technology — films, materials, devices, applications and systems — on a scale of 1–100 nanometers. But what is a nanometer? A nanometer is one billionth of a meter or 40 billionths of an inch. A human hair is between 50 and 100 microns wide — and a micron is 1,000 nanometers. A DNA molecule is about 2½ nanometers wide. A typical human

hair is between 50,000 and 100,000 nanometers wide. So, we could stack at least 1000 nano-devices across the end of a human hair

Amateurs Activated as Tornado Strikes

(Jan 28, 2008) -- On the afternoon of January 10, an [EF3 tornado](#) hit [Caledonia, Mississippi](#), approximately 60 miles southeast of Tupelo. The tornado caused major damage to the town of 1000 people; an elementary school gymnasium was severely damaged.

The Lowndes County Emergency Operations Center activated area storm spotters in advance of the approaching storm; hams assigned to the

EOC activated the Amateur Radio station there and started to gather information on the weather. After the storm passed, EOC personnel requested assistance from radio operators to help with reports of major damage to homes and buildings in the town.

The EOC set up a command post at the fire station down-

town and asked members of [ARES](#) to provide communication between the EOC and Red Cross; the Red Cross had set up a shelter at a local church not too far from the affected area, and local amateurs set up portable lights and generators.
