Valentines Day~ The Meaning Of Rose Colors

When giving cut roses as Valentine gifts, we adhere to a time-honored formula that takes into account rose color meanings. The formula matches a flower's color to its intended meaning as a gift. Valentine's Day is primarily a lovers' holiday, and red is traditionally reserved for lovers. Red Valentine roses enjoy an iconic status, even though other colors have their place on the holiday. Our close family members may also be treated to red posies for Valentine's Day, but we avoid this color choice for friends on Valentine's Day -- that would simply convey the wrong meaning. The following are the meanings traditionally ascribed to the most popular roses, according to colors; use this list as a guide when selecting Valentine roses:

- ~Red means romantic love (the "Valentine roses," par excellence).
- ~Purple, coral and orange challenge red as the color for Valentine roses.

The rose color meanings for these 3 are as follows:

- ~The specific purpose of purple roses is to signify that the giver has fallen in love with the recipient at first sight.
- ~Meanwhile, coral signals desire.
- ~And **orange** roses, along with **apricot**, connote enthusiasm.
- ~The meaning of **yellow** roses is joy and friendship.
- ~We express our gratitude and appreciation with **pink** roses....While feelings of admiration and sympathy find words with roses that are light pink in color.
- ~Peach is more ambiguous, as it can signify either sympathy or gratitude.
- ~Their purity naturally enough lends to **white** roses the meaning of reverence and humility.

Recipe of the month~ Ritz Cheese Steak Sliders!

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 1 1/2 cups balsamic vinegar
- 1 lb. trimmed thin-cut boneless beef rib-eye steak
- 1/2 tsp. each granulated garlic, chili powder and dry mustard
- 1/2 tsp. each dried thyme, basil, kosher salt and fresh cracked black pepper
- 1/4 tsp. each white pepper and cayenne 4 tbsp. olive oil, divided
- 1 cup sweet onion, quartered and thinly sliced
- 1 cup red bell pepper, cut in julienne strips, 1" long
- 1/2 cup each yellow bell pepper and Anaheim Chile, cut in julienne strips, 1" long
- 1 tbsp. garlic, minced
- 1 1/2 tbsp. balsamic vinegar
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 pkg. (8 oz.) Kraft Jalapeño American Cheese slices
- Ritz Crackers

Directions:



• Cut meat across the grain into 1/4" thick slices, then julienne to 1" long pieces. in a large bowl, combine dry spices. add steak pieces; toss to evenly coat. set aside.

In a small sauce pan, bring 1 1/2 cups balsamic vinegar to a boil, then simmer gently over low heat 40 minutes until reduced to 1/3 cup.

- In a large nonstick skillet, heat 2 tbsp. of the olive oil over medium-high heat. add the onions, bell peppers and Anaheim Chile and sauté 4-5 minutes, stirring occasionally, add garlic and cook 1-2 minutes, remove to a plate, heat remaining oil in same skillet, add steak and cook 2 minutes until done, stirring frequently, add the 1 1/2 tbsp. balsamic vinegar and the Worcestershire sauce, stir to combine, add the vegetables and cook until heated through. Drain excess liquid.
- preheat oven to 350°F. Cut each cheese slice into 6 pieces. place 1 piece on each of 48 crackers, then top with approximately 1 thsp. of the steak mixture. place on a foil-lined baking sheet. Bake for 5 minutes, or until cheese melts. place on serving plate and drizzle with the balsamic reduction. top each with a second cracker.
