### Arrl files new proposal

League Files "A Plan for the Next Decade" with FCC (Jan 28, 2004) --The ARRL has filed a Petition for Rule Making asking the FCC to amend its Part 97 rules to complete the Amateur Service restructuring the Commission began in 1999 but left unfinished. The League wants the FCC to create a new entry-level license, reduce the number of actual license classes to three and drop Morse the code testina requirement for all classes except for Amateur Extra (see "ARRL to Propose New Entry-Level License, Code-Free HF Access"). The ARRL says its petition follows in the footsteps of changes in Article 25 of the international Radio Regulations adopted World at Radiocommunication Conference 2003.

Amona those changes, **WRC-03** deleted the Morse testing requirement for amateur applicants seeking HF privileges and left it up to individual countries to determine whether or not they want to mandate Morse testing. While several countries -- including Germany, the UK and Australia -dropped already have their Morse requirements, testing the ARRL emphasized Fin Qits petition that Morse code is not the printer structure at hand.  $\begin{array}{c|c} \hline & 2200 \\ \hline & Changes in {3.777} \\ \hline 1810 \\ \hline 1030, 1615, 1845 \\ \hline spect of th {3.708} \\ \hline 3.708 \\ \hline 9.925 \\ \hline 9.925$ insufficient for the Commission to address those issues in a vacuum," the said, calling its licensing League proposal "a plan for the next decade." The ARRL said that plan's overall intention is "to encourage newcomers to the Amateur Service and to encourage those who enter its ranks to proceed further on a course of technical selftraining and exposure to all aspects of the avocation."

> While just dropping the Element 1 (5 WPM) Morse requirement may seem to be a "simple plan," the ARRL said, it fails to address the critical need for an entry-level ticket other than the Technician. The Technician license, the League said, "is for too many a 'dead end' to what might otherwise be an active, progressive interest in Amateur technical self-training Radio. and incentive-based educational progress in the many facets of the avocation."

> The ARRL said its proposed entrylevel license--being called "Novice" for now--would establish "a portfolio of operating privileges consistent with an Arrl files new proposal (cont. . .) examination that would not include material that is inappropriate or

irrelevant at the entry level." It would require passing a 25-question written examination--but no code test--and offer limited HF phone, image, CW and data privileges.

<u>A copy of the ARRL's Petition for Rule</u> <u>Making</u> is available on the ARRL Web site. The FCC has requested that individuals refrain from contacting or attempting to comment to the FCC on the ARRL's restructuring proposal before the FCC issues a Rule Making (RM) number for the ARRL petition and invites public comments on it. Until that happens, it is premature to comment to the FCC.

### Mansfield hamfest

The main hamfest in our general area during the winter months is the Mansfield Hamfest which takes place this month, on February 8, 2004. Sponsored by the Inter-City ARC, this hamfest is quite a large one that takes place in the fairgrounds just outside of Mansfield. I was browsing the qrz.com website recently and came across a homebrewing contest for hams to build their own radio equipment and submit it in a competition. Turns out the competition is in India, VU-land. But, it appears that any hams anywhere are eligible to enter this contest, though submitting your equipment might cost a bit to get it there. You must first submit your plans and schematics via the internet, then, if your plans are amongst those considered suitable and worthwhile, you would need to submit the finished item. Check it out, the winners will be published on the internet and this might be your chance to get the recognition your deserve.

### New satellite

Would you like to have your name in orbit? Well, you can do this by contributing to the launching of the latest Amsat amateur radio satellite, the Echo satellite. An integration and testing team, led by Jim White (WD0E) and Mike **Kingerv** (KE4AZN), was assembled in December 2003 at SpaceQuest in Fairfax, VA. During this initial integration session, 90% of Echo's hardware was successfully tested and most of the telemetry calibration was accomplished. Even the new experimental L-band receiver and S-band transmitter functioned well during their first tests.

The launch window opens in late March, so the satellite is coming together on plan.

There is still time for you to have your name placed in orbit. The names of all contributors will be placed inside the ECHO satellite. AMSAT-NA has not yet reached its fund raising goal of \$110,000 for the ECHO launch. to pav Visit www.amsat.org to link to pictures of ECHO during integration, and to make a contribution. Join AMSAT!
