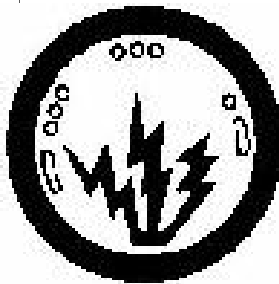

PAPER CHASE

Did you make the contacts to obtain the WAS (Worked All Steves) certificate I mentioned last month? I did not, only got two of them, so this month I have another certificate that you should easily obtain even though it requires contacting fifteen Museum Ships.

This year there is a new sponsor and a new date. The Battleship New Jersey (BB-62) Amateur Radio Station has replace the USS Salem (CA-139) Radio Club as the sponsor and the event will take place from 0000Z June 3rd through 2359 June 4th, 2006.

There are now 65 ships signed up to participate. There are 2 Aircraft Carriers, 6 Battleships, 3 Cruisers, 5 Destroyers and many many more. One of the interesting ones is the President's Yacht, USS Potomac, a Coast Guard Cutter. It is located in Oakland, California and will use

the call sign KI6ASN. If you are a member of the International Light House Society, there will be 4 lightships in the event. With ships being sunk to form reefs for fish, none of these ships will be activated for IOTA. You can find all 65 ships listed at <http://users.tellurian.com/freddie/nj2bb/ship-event.html>.

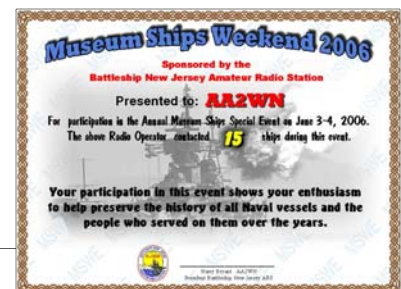

FIELD DAY MOVES TO A NEW LOCATION

The 2006 WARA Field Day exercise, one of the highlights of the club's radio calendar, will be held at a new location this year, right in the heart of downtown Warren. Field Day Coordinator, Pete Kozup, K8OUA, advises that this year's Field Day will be held on Courthouse Square in downtown Warren. The main reason for the change of venue, according to Pete, can be summed up in three words, "Publicity, Publicity, Publicity." It is hoped that by holding Field Day downtown we will be in the light of all the publicity we can muster, and we hope to have a presence not only in the local newspaper, but perhaps on radio and even TV as well. Who knows, we might even be able to have a politician or two present!!

Field Day is always held on the last full weekend in June, this year on June 24 and 25. We will set up on Friday

evening, June 23 and be ready to operate on Saturday morning, June 24, 2006.

We intend to have at least a 4 Alpha station (four different transmitters running off generator power), a GOTA station (set up with a different call sign for both beginners to the hobby and those who haven't operated for awhile) and we will include at least one VHF station. We will have an ATV (Amateur Television) station, and hopefully we'll be trying to contact one of the hams on the International Space Station as well.

Whether you want to operate or just watch there will be something for you to do. We hope to have members available at all times to show visitors attracted to the site around and explain what is happening, and we intend to have a display table that will include papers and brochures

explaining amateur radio to the public. So, no matter what your amateur radio tastes, even if it's just eating, you're invited to Courthouse Square in downtown Warren, the northeast corner, where the gazebo is, to help out.
