PAPER CHASE

Summer is here and Field Day is over so where does that leave us? It leaves us with time to pursue some of those pieces of paper we would like to earn.

In the last two weeks, six meters has been open to all parts of the United States and to Europe. The first "BIG" award for six meters is the VUCC Award awarded by the ARRL. To earn it you must have confirmed 100 Maidenhead Squares. A square is a two by one degree block on the earth's surface. We are in EN91, which is 80-82 degrees west longitude and 41-42 degrees north latitude. There is a separate award for six and two meters. More information can be found on the ARRL website. www.arrl.org, or the handbook. It is a lot of fun and the antennas do not have to be elaborate, though it helps. I have worked as far as New Jersey on two meters using a 1/4 wave ground plane and on six meters to the Netherlands with a Saturn Halo. You can do it too and enjoy the thrill of accomplishment and the agony of missing out, ala Jim McKay.
