## Skywarn recognition day

ARRL-National Weather Service SKYWARN Recognition Day is December 4 -- The sixth annual ARRL-National Weather Service SKYWARN Recognition Day (SRD) event will take place Saturday, December 4. Begun in 1999, SKYWARN Recognition Day pays tribute to Amateur Radio SKYWARN volunteers for the vital services they

provide during weather-related emergencies. During the 24-hour activity, radio amateurs set up stations at National Weather Service (NWS) offices and work as a team to contact other hams around the world.
